




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Dear parents and carers

Thank You and Sorry

Thank you for your continued support - we continue to receive lots of positive comments from parents and carers (and from colleagues at some of our feeder primary schools) about the start to this academic year. There is also more positive news; we have received our highest number of new Year 7 first preference applications for September 2023 in over 5 years. It is great to hear that the local community is recognising us as their school of choice. As previously mentioned, I have high ambitions for the College and we will continue to look at ways to improve in any way we can to ensure all of our students get the best education we can offer. Your feedback is invaluable in helping us achieve this, so please continue to let us know what is and is not working well from your perspective.

We are not perfect though and despite the good start, I would like to apologise if you have been receiving a high number of emails about trips and consent forms. This has caused confusion and frustration for a number of parents and carers. We decided to move to an online data collection form (including general consent for trips) to make collation of students' information much easier to manage. However, this has taken longer than expected, so we have had to issue additional consent forms for a number of trips that have taken place so far this term. In addition, for each individual trip further consents are required. As this has caused, understandably, confusion we are assessing the situation and will send out a letter next week to clarify exactly what is needed.
