Dear Parents and Carers

As we near the end of the first half term, I want to take the opportunity to thank you for all the support you have given to your child and the College. We ask that you continue to support us in making this happen, by ensuring that your child meets the expectations below, every day.

#### **Attendance & Punctuality**

Being in school is the first step to success. **You will shortly receive details of your child's attendance so far this academic year, together with an explanatory letter.**

#### **Uniform**

Full details of our school uniform are available on our website. There have been no recent changes to this. It is important that your child be dressed in full school uniform every day. On the rare occasions when this is not possible, your child's Pastoral Support Assistant will be able to loan a clean replacement item for the day.

Unlike many schools, Helston Community College allows students to wear one nose stud, if they wish, alongside a stud in each ear lobe. No other piercings are permitted. Hairstyles which include hair dye of a non-natural colour, or any form of pattern shaved into the hair, are not permitted. Should your child currently have a piercing or hairstyle that does not meet our uniform policy, please ensure that this is corrected over the half term. After this, any students who do not meet the Uniform Policy will receive sanctions until this is corrected.

#### **Mobile Telephones**

A reminder that mobile telephones are not to be visible during the school day. In an age of continual access to the Internet and social media, it is important that young people have a safe space away from this, as well as allowing them to focus on their learning and social skills. Mobile phones visible in school will be confiscated and returned to the student at the end of the day.

## **Covid-19 & Face Coverings**

Covid-19 rates continue to increase across Cornwall, with over half of new cases occurring in schools. In view of this, we have enclosed an "Important Notice" which includes information from Public Health Cornwall. This notice details steps that you and your child should take during the half term and when they return to school. Please read this carefully.

## **Medication**


