LETTER FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents, Carers and Students

This is our fourth edition of The Helstonian and once again it is full of photos and articles about some of the great activities students have been involved with. It also celebrates some of the great achievements of our students. I hope you enjoy browsing through it over Easter.

I'd like to thank those of you who completed the recent parent survey. Overall, it is a very positive picture with 86% of you saying that you would recommend the college to other parents. Against national benchmarks, this statistic is considered 'outstanding'. However, until it is 100%, we will continue to look at ways to further improve. Of all the questions asked, all but two have shown significant improvement since the last survey in June 2022. Of particular note, were the percentage of you saying your child is happy and feels safe; how much student behaviour had improved, and how we were doing better with communication.

On another positive note, I'd like to publicly celebrate the achievements of our wonderful Deputy Headteacher, Paula Martin. Paula was nominated for the Pearson National Teaching Awards as an 'Unsung Hero' by one of our students. The award recognises school staff who have positively enhanced the lives of others in their school community; working quietly behind the scenes with a positive attitude, always showing a willingness to help and who consistently go the extra mile. We are very proud to have Ms Martin as part of the College. Her commitment to supporting the staff and the students is both impressive and relentless - she thoroughly deserves this recognition.

ABSENCE – Important Notices for Parents and Carers

If your child is absent from College, please can you call the College every day of their absence before 9.15am. Please leave a message with specific detail as to why they are unable to attend. Please can we also ask you to let us know of any medical/orthodontist appointments in advance. This helps unnecessary phone calls being made.

Please note: If your child is absent from College without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent/carer, per child and each carry a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the College may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.




Helston Lantern Procession Saturday 4 March

LEGO Robotics



Led by Year 11, Ned Petre, the Lego club were lucky enough to take part in a visit to RNAS Culdrose in Helston. The students took part in the regional 'Lego First' robotics heats at the naval base.



Following a tour of one of the aircraft hangars, where they discovered the vast array of different displays, including a naval fire engine, Search and Rescue equipment and medical first aid demonstrations, the team watched a Science show, presented by Mad Science.



Next was the robotics task, where they had to put their robot through its paces to complete as many of the pre-designed tasks as possible. After a difficult start and some tweaking to the coding, the team did very well and scored a respectable 140 points on their best run.



Finally was the 'Innovation Project', where the team presented their idea for an offshore solar farm. The presentation was given to a number of high ranking navy personnel and members from the STEM hub. The team's presentation went very well and they were able to field some very challenging questions from the panel, showing a huge amount of confidence in their idea.



We ended the day with a presentation by Captain Stuart Irwin, who presented the team from HCC with an award for their innovation project, specifically the sustainability thought given to their work.

Not only was their presentation well thought out and engaging but Seth even made a prototype of the train at home. Well done for the time and dedication put into this.




Spotlight on Creative Careers: *Julia Cockerham*

Continuing with the College's first Kindness Month, students have been creating kind and positive message pebbles this week. These will be distributed around Helston to those who are most vulnerable.




Also, last Thursday we held our Cake Sale and raised £57.26 which was amazing and all the money raised will be donated to Cancer Research UK.

Geology Fieldwork

This month Years 12 and 13 geologists visited Coverack Beach as part of their course fieldwork. The trip was led by Dr Kate Moore from the University of Exeter. The students applied their knowledge of minerals to identify rocks that formed deep in the mantle and worked out the relationship between the different rock types. As they crossed Coverack beach Dr Moore explained they had just walked over the boundary between the crust and the mantle, one of the few places in the world where tectonic forces has brought the boundary to the surface. The students fieldwork investigating the unique geology of Cornwall will continue in the summer term.



Mock Trials

After 6 months of practising their roles as lawyers, witnesses, defendants and magistrates our Mock Trials Team took part in their long awaited competition. After competing against four schools we were very proud to draw as winners with another local school.

The Helston geographers expertly presented their proposals to all the participants in the council chamber and subsequently defended their




