### **Royal Shakespeare Company Event**

Helston Community College is part of the Associate Schools programme run by the RSC. The programme is the RSC's national partnership project run by schools and regional theatres, in partnership with the RSC. The fundamental ambition of the Associate Schools programme is to transform experiences of Shakespeare and live theatre for young people.

The programme includes opportunities for students in performance, leadership and career development. On Monday 20 June we took part in a Regional Playmaking Festival where we joined with several other schools across Cornwall to perform Much Ado About Nothing. Each school taking on a section of the play to rehearse and then perform at the Hall for Cornwall. This gave the students the unique opportunity of working alongside professionals in a variety of roles at the Hall for Cornwall. They had a wonderful time and can't wait for the next one!



#### Army careers Medical Pathway event.

On Friday 24 June Year 12 students took part in an Army careers Medical Pathway event.

The day was broken down into informative and practical first aid sessions. The students were learning how to gain a career in Army Medicine, Veterinary, Dentistry, Pharmacy, physiotherapy and Bio Medicine to name a few.

The students were given some basic CABCD first aid lessons and shown how the military use some equipment such as tourniquets, field dressings and other medical kit and then put their learning into practice by trying some of these techniques on each other. The students also talked about different medical scenarios aimed at testing the student's reactions to different medical issues.

The students enjoyed the session and some now have another avenue to think about after they finish their A Levels next year. They could potentially earn whilst they learn. One of the students said that it had open their eyes up to what the Military can offer and was very appreciative of today's event.





#### London Trip

On 23 - 24 June 2022, Mr McFadden, Mrs Price, Mrs Asbridge, Miss Hemsworth and Miss Hawkey took forty-five Year 9 students to London where they took part in a range of activities related to English and experienced a variety of things that the city had to offer.

Students took a backstage tour at The National Theatre given by two current employees of the theatre. Students learned about set design and staging, prop and costume creation and were given the opportunity to look behind the scenes of one of the theatre's upcoming productions.

The final stop of the trip was to the Harry Potter Studios in Watford. Staff stated that "It was truly magical to see the excitement and awe on the students' faces as they walked between the authentic film sets and saw the actual costumes and props used in the films."







Richard Lander school invited 12 year 9 students from Helston Community College to join them for their annual Women in Leadership conference. The day started with key note speaker Amanda Fisher, CEO of Amey. Amey is one of the top FTSE 250 companies in the UK, only 18 only of which have women CEO's, of which Amanda is one. Amey are a leading infrastructure and engineering services company which provide critical public services. Amanda gave our future women leaders an honest an inspiring talk, full of tips on how to manage your life, tweaks which can make a big difference, how to believe in yourself, compete and succeed in the male dominated working world of construction and engineering. Amanda was followed up to the podium by Emily Davies, Director of Social Impact at Amey. Emily shared a great insight into a colour coding exercise with our students, to work out how you can best to interact with other people in the workplace, to make your career progress (and to make working life nicer for everyone!)

Next, 16 women leaders from the voluntary and business sector spent time with each of our young women discussing their pathway to success, fears and hopes for the future and offering tips an hints about how to achieve your dreams. The ended with a team building, bridge construction activity, where our engineers of the future were tasked to create a bridge which would span a specified gap and take the maximum number of weights. Well done to these winning and very creative teams!





#### Falmouth University Photography Visit

A group of year 12 Fine Art students recently visited the Barbara Hepworth Sculpture Garden and the Tate St Ives. The students took part in a workshop where they explored working in three dimensions inspired by the themes within Barbara Hepworth's work. At the Tate St Ives the students enjoyed a talk about the colourful and geometric paintings by Latin American artist Ad Minoliti. 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#### Writers Workshop

On Wednesday 13 July, we had the pleasure of taking 16 Yr7 students for a workshop at Heartlands with the fantastic Cornish author Rebecca Tantony. Rebecca is an internationally published author who has performed her work at various venues around the UK, such as the Royal Albert Hall and The Southbank Centre.

The sun was shining as we arrived at Heartlands, the students were buzzing with anticipation and couldn't wait to flex their creative muscles!

To start with, students had the chance to take part in at 'Rhyme War' where they were put into groups to rhyme as many words as they could.

After some fast-paced rhyming action, Rebecca brought out her mystery box full of various exciting objects to inspire some fantastic use of personification. Students had to write from the perspective of an object of their choice without telling the rest of the group what they had selected. We had great fun guessing what everyone had picked!

Next, students created a poem inspired by their own name. These were absolutely fantastic! It was a pleasure to see all the students proudly sharing their creations with the group. There are definitely some budding poets amongst us!

Finally, students had the chance to write their own six word story inspired by Ernest Hemmingway's 'For Sale, Baby Shoes, Never Worn'. Using only six words, they had to craft a story idea.
