


Mark making techniques in drawing shading techniques


Shading is how artists give the two dimensional drawing a three dimensional effects by blending in light and dark tones using the medium chosen























### Renaissance Drawing








Francois BOUCHER 1703 -1770





a French painter, draughtsman and etcher, who worked in the ROCOCO style. Boucher is known for his idyllic and voluptuous paintings on classical themes, decorative allegories, and pastoral scenes. He was perhaps the most celebrated painter and decorative artist of the 18th century. He also painted several portraits of his patroness, Madame de Pompadour. 



## Pablo PICASSO

Pablo Picasso was a Spanish painter, sculptor, printmaker, ceramicist, stage designer, poet and playwright who spent most of his adult life in France. As one of the greatest and most influential artists of the 20th century, he is known for co-founding the Cubist movement, the invention of constructed sculpture, the coinvention of collage, and for the wide variety of styles that he helped develop and explore. Among his most famous works are the proto-Cubist Les Demoiselles d'Avignon (1907), and Guernica (1937), a portrayal of the Bombing of Guernica by the German and Italian airforces at the behest of the Spanish nationalist government during the Spanish Civil War

### **HENRY MOORE** – Drawings

He is best known for his semi abstract monumental bronze sculptures which are located around the world as public works of art. As well as sculpture, Moore produced many drawings

He uses Drawing Systems to be **EXPRESSIVE** and communicate **form** through his use of **line**. He uses hatching, cross-hatching, dot and carry, stippling, contour lines, scribbling and pattern.
