




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COVID-19 Weekly Newsletter For Parents, Carers and Students 25 January 2021

Introduction/Headlines

Welcome to our first Covid-19 newsletter, which we have produced to pass on key information in one communication rather than lots of separate emails. We hope it will prove to be a useful reference source.

Grading consultation

The Government has launched a joint consultation with Ofqual on how grades should be awarded in summer 2021. The consultation closes at 11:45pm on Friday 29 January. They want to hear the views of students who were due to take their exams this year, their parents and carers, as well as their teachers and school and college leaders.

The proposal is a consultation and the plans could change. The one thing that appears to be certain is that they will be 'Teacher Assessed grades'. So we want to emphasise the importance of engaging with remote learning and continuing to submit work online during this lockdown period.

The proposal is quite lengthy, but we have tried to summarise the situation for a range of courses into one or two sentences. In essence, the Government's consultation proposes the following:

A-levels, AS, GCSE: The consultation suggests that teacher assessed grades could be guided by a test provided by exam boards, which will be used in conjunction with other evidence. It is proposed that these tests are sat in late May and early June. The proposal also states that Non-Exam Assessments (coursework) should be completed (as far as is possible). Some subjects which have a large NEA component (e.g. Art) are likely to use the NEA without a test.

Applied Courses (BTEC, Cambridge Nationals etc.) will rely more on internal assessments. Internal assessments should be completed (as far as is possible). In many cases, additional assessment evidence from teachers will be essential to enable the award of a qualification.

We realise that these proposals may create more questions than answers, so we hope that the final decisions by Ofqual are made promptly.

Please be aware that there are around 70 questions and not all will seem relevant. The outcome is likely to be announced in the week beginning 22nd February.
















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

Covid-19 – In School Lateral Flow Testing

We have begun to roll out our testing programme in College, testing our staff members over the last week. We are beginning our testing of students who are attending the key worker provision this week. In line with the latest guidance, we are only testing to identify asymptomatic cases as part of our measures to keep the College environment as safe as possible; we are not using daily tests as an alternative to isolating for close contacts of positive cases.

IT

A number of staff have produced short 'how to' videos to help with a range of online IT issues. These will start to be uploaded to the remote learning portal this week.

We have a small number of Chromebooks available to loan out to students who have limited access to a device and have been informed that the next delivery is unlikely to be before March. The Government has informed us that a number of mobile phone providers are temporarily increasing the data allowance for students. Free School Meals

Due to a change in the government process from the week commencing 18 January 2021, we will be moving to Edenred to issue Free School Meals vouchers.

The MAT Office is currently in the process of ordering the vouchers; these will be sent out by email if we have an email address for you on our College system and by post otherwise. Vouchers will be ordered every Friday for that week and should be released within 4 days of the order being approved, but please bear with us for the first week while the new system is established.

Important Dates

We have some important events coming up in the next few weeks, which will still be taking place despite the current lockdown, albeit in a different format.

Year 11 - Parents and carers are invited to attend the Virtual Post 16 Open Evening, along with their children. This event will take place by video link on Thursday 28 January 2021. This event will be followed in February by online interviews with all Year 11 students to discuss their options and possible course choices.

Year 9 - Next week, parents and carers will receive an invitation to attend the Year 9 Parent Teacher Consultation Evening, which will take place on Wednesday 3 February 2021. Further details including how to book appointments will be included in the invitation. This event will be followed by the Year 9 Virtual Options Evening on Wednesday 10 February 2021. Details about this event and the options process will be sent out shortly.

Keyworker Provision Bookings

We have 10% of our students attending in-school provision at the moment, which is double the national average for secondary schools. This requires approximately 11 teachers plus support staff in College each day to supervise and requires advanced planning.

Parents and carers who have informed us that they require places on the College's provision for the children of keyworkers and vulnerable students will be sent a link to the booking form by email and/or text each Wednesday. Please could we ask that you complete the form by 1pm each **Friday**, to allow us to organise our staffing for the following week.
